COVID News from the General Manager

Dear Residents and Families of Roselani Place,

Late last month we experienced COVID activity and currently have 3 active cases. We will continue our testing rounds until serial testing comes back all negative. We have the ability to test those who may have been exposed and/or experiencing any symptom(s). **Please inform a Nurse, Resident Assistant or the Receptionist if you don't feel well.**

Residents, staff, visitors and guests are not required to wear face masks while in our Community. However, should we have an active staff or resident case, we encourage you to wear a face mask for your protection and for others. I also ask should one present any symptom(s) that is not COVID related, then to please wear a face mask.

Wash your hands often and please utilize the hand sanitizer stations throughout the building. We encourage you to wear a face mask that covers your nose and mouth upon leaving your room and when assisted by any one of our staff members. If you are in need of a free face mask, please ask us and are made available at the Front Desk.

Regular visits to the Community to see residents in their room, continue for families and friends. Our dining rooms are at a max capacity, so please inquire with us prior if you wish to dine with your loved one. **If someone is exposed or is experiencing COVID or flu symptoms, we strongly urge our guests to refrain from visiting and to re-schedule their visit.**

Visits can be conducted daily and for any out of the facility visits, please inform us of the date, time, and approximate length of when you will be out of the facility; **at least 24-48 hours in advance of leaving**, to our Receptionist. Before leaving the facility, please sign out at the Front Desk.

Roselani Place stays committed to the well-being of our residents. Our Health Services Team also wants to remind you to wash your hands often. Please inform our team in the Med Room when you have a medical appointment. When you feel sick or ill, please press your call pendant and inform any staff member or nurse.

I am available to address any concerns or questions you may have. On behalf of myself and all the staff of Roselani Place, we want to thank our residents and their families for their continued support and understanding to keep our community safe for everyone this summer.

History of Father's Day

The campaign to celebrate the nation's fathers did not meet with the same enthusiasm—perhaps because, as one florist explained, “fathers haven't the same sentimental appeal that mothers have.”

On July 5, 1908, a West Virginia church sponsored the nation's first event explicitly in honor of fathers, a Sunday sermon in memory of the 362 men who had died in the previous December's explosions at the Fairmont Coal Company mines in Monongah, but it was a one-time commemoration and not an annual holiday.

The next year in Spokane, Washington, a woman named Sonora Smart Dodd, one of six children raised by a widower, tried to establish an official equivalent to Mother's Day for male parents. She went to local churches, the YMCA, shopkeepers and government officials to drum up support for her idea, and she was successful: Washington State celebrated the nation's first statewide Father's Day on June 19, 1910.

Slowly, the holiday spread. In 1916, President Wilson honored the day by using telegraph signals to unfurl a flag in Spokane when he pressed a button in Washington, D.C. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge urged state governments to observe Father's Day. Today, the day honoring fathers is celebrated in the United States on the third Sunday of June.

June is National Rose Month

President Ronald Reagan signed legislation in 1986 that made the rose the United States' National Floral Emblem. People everywhere have been passionate about roses for centuries. Roses represent beauty and love to millions. Roses are an ancient symbol of festivals and the commemoration of historic events. Our name Roselani is always of interest, especially to folks outside of Maui. It is the "Americanization" of the Hawaiian word Lokelani, which means "heavenly rose" and is Maui's official flower.

Did You Know These Facts About Roses?

- More than 1.2 BILLION fresh cut roses are sold each year.
- The world's oldest living rose is thought to be 1,000 years old. Today it continues to flourish on the wall of the Hildesheim Cathedral of Germany.
- The rose is the favorite flower of 85 percent of Americans.
- Thousands of songs have been sung about roses, including, "Red Roses for a Blue Lady," "Ramblin' Rose," "My Wild Irish Rose," "Everything's Comin' Up Roses," "Yellow Rose of Texas," "Days of Wine and Roses," and, of course, "Mama Liked the Roses," a song recorded by Elvis Presley in 1969. The Tournament of Roses began in 1890 as a festival. In 1902, a football game was added for entertainment.
